

GREETINGS FROM FR CORNELL

Beloved in Christ! Dear members & friends of our Cathedral community!

Warmest greetings from me and my family! Sincerest and constant prayers for health and safety for you and your family as we continue to sacrifice for one-another and navigate our way, together, through the COVID-19 pandemic!

Willingly receiving flesh from the Virgin, the Most High has been delivered into the world as equal to men, to cleanse us of the venom of the serpent's head, leading all from the sunless gates of Hades to life-bearing light, in that He is God. (Tropar from Canon II of Ode IV on the Feast of the Nativity)

Out of His great love for all mankind, God sends to us, in the flesh, taking on *our* nature, His Only-begotten Son, to lead us away from the gates of Hades and toward paradise and eternal life; to make eternal life a **reality**. The Nativity is, therefore, the realization of God's immeasurable love for us; a love which will be culminated in the ultimate act of suffering and death on the Cross for us, through which life is bestowed upon all of us, including those in the tombs, by His glorious resurrection on the third day from the tomb!

Why is it important to emphasize these truths this particular year, as we are navigating through the Nativity Fast, onward to the Feast? Well, because humanity finds itself needing "cleansing of venom" of a new, unseen serpent that has cast us into a state in which our attention is drawn – alas – toward death and darkness by unprecedented access to information about infection numbers, hospitalization percentages, the political drama of "who knows better," and, of course, rate of death. It is important to emphasize the reality of **life** beginning with the coming of God in the flesh, because, as noted above, it is so easy for us to fall into a "death culture," which comes not from a place of joy and faith, but from fear and despondency; which finds a place for itself in the growing lack of faith in our contemporary culture. In all the noise, we forget that Hades' gates are no more! They are no more because He, who is salvation, a Light for the enlightenment of the gentiles and the glory of (God's) people, Israel, who for us men and for our salvation came down from the heavens has destroyed them! And even though many have suffered, many have died, God will destroy COVID-19, by granting knowledge and talents to scientists and medical professionals who will discover and administer the vaccines and medications that will free us from this serpent! So, let us turn from dwelling on the bad news, and contemplate and rejoice in the words of St. John Chrysostom, declared each Pascha: O death, where is your sting? O Hades, where is your victory?

A few of years ago, I wrote a cautionary about being drawn into the "abstracts" the secular, non-believing world presents to us at this time, each year: the "spirit of Christmas," "joy of the season," etc. Certainly, there is nothing abstract about the COVID-19 pandemic! There are no abstracts about this "season" in 2020, either! We are compelled by reality to prepare ourselves for an intimate, quiet, small scale celebration of the appearance of Emmanuel – "God is with us."

Therefore, I hope we will take advantage of the opportunity to recall that Holy Night in Bethlehem over two millennia ago – intimate, quiet, small scale, amid insecurity and oppression. I hope we take the time to appreciate the important things we have been given. I hope we take time to consider how fragile we are when forced to sacrifice our excesses. I hope we will allow ourselves to realize "we're all in this together" is nothing new! It is how we were created to be – everyone is my neighbour! I hope we can see how quickly adversity can turn us from joy and rejoicing to sorrow and despair.

I hope, ultimately, that even in this reality of a "pandemic Christmas," we, Christians, will resolve to turn from the "sunless gates of Hades" toward the "life-bearing light" that is Christ, a real Child, Who is the One True God, Who died for us and rose from the dead, indeed, so that we may enjoy eternal life in Paradise... REALLY!

The Scholarships will be presented to the five individuals at a special presentation following a Divine Liturgy at St. John's Cathedral in December, as well as at the AUSRL Virtual Annual General Meeting to be held on January 25, 2021!

We are excited to share that the 2020 CYMK-UOY Scholarship is being awarded to first time recipients Santina Dowbush and Pavlo Tsisar. As well, previous recipients Adam Jereniuk, Marco Kruhlak, Nikolai Kruhlak – will also receive a scholarship in 2020. These five individuals are members of St. John's Senior CYMK. Hawrysh Scholarships

OCTOBER 18, 2020

Thanksgiving is a time to thank God for our blessings, food, good health safety, and give back to the community.

The Hawrysh Scholarship is awarded to students who are members or whose parents are members of St. John's Orthodox Cathedral for at least three years.

All applicants must apply before June 15th and transcripts must be submitted by August 15 of the current year.

The Scholarship is open to students who enroll in the following undergraduate programs.

- Faculty of Theology- St. Andrews College Winnipeg
- Faculty of Education- Majoring in Ukrainian language education
- Faculty of Arts- Majoring in Ukrainian language, history, or Ukrainian-Canadian Studies

All applications must be forwarded to the church administrator.

Another William & Mary Memorial Scholarship since 1988 is available at the University of Alberta, which is for all faculties, first year students must be of Canadian citizen, who completed Grades X, XI, XII, in an Alberta High School. Now valued at \$5000.00, apply early is entering the U of A in September. Only 3 from St. John's received it so far.

In 2013, I set up a third scholarship: Babich/ Babichuk Memorial Scholarship for Agriculture. For a student from Ukraine to study agriculture at the U of A and return to Ukraine to teach it there, or for a teacher from Alberta to teach it in Ukraine. So far 3 women from Ukraine came to study at the U of A. Congratulations to Pavlo Tsisar to receive the St. John's Award for \$750.00. God bless you with much success.





Underground Soldier by Marsha Forchuk Skrypuch is a young adult novel from our English language section. This fascinating and well written story informs the reader about the Ukrainian Insurgent Army or the UPA—Українська Повстаньська Армія which operated during WWII, a well-organized network of guerrilla fighters. It struggled against both Nazi and Soviet invaders of Ukraine. Through the eyes of Luka, a twelve-year-old slave labour victim of the Nazis, the reader learns about the courage and resilience of Ukrainians and other Eastern Europeans in their quest for freedom. Luka's experiences are harrowing and his story unfolds suspensefully throughout the book. Even grandmothers like me will enjoy this revealing page turner!

TREASURER'S MESSAGE

Seasons Greetings!

A brief report to share on our financial health:

- Its always amazing when the power of community comes together with their generosity to make a difference. Your giving during our Thanksgiving campaign amounted thus far to over \$8500 helping our parish in these trying times. Thank you and please continue your support and blessings thru our Koliada season.
- Our average monthly operating revenues for October and November have been \$22500 with average operating expenses of 27500 leaving a monthly deficit of \$5000 - the catering area and its supplementary revenue is definitely missed. Thankfully the federal government wage subsidy program has been enough to cover off this deficit. This govt program is slated to continue for the first part of 2021.
- Outside of our operating budget we have been affected by the
 necessary repairs and safety upgrades the parish has had to undertake
 unfortunately in a difficult financial year. Security system (\$12000) and
 fire alarm upgrades (\$34000), rehabilitation of the manse that has not
 seen any major repairs for close to 20-25 years due to water damage and
 age(\$14000 to date) has given us additional costs of \$60000 so far this
 year with more work to come which we have had to secure financing for
 now. Part of the financing is through a govt interest free loan and grant
 program.
